- a. Source, care, allocation, movement between locations, use and fate of all animals
- b. Detail of any illness, injury or other matter that has impacted on the welfare of animals and the remedial action taken
- c. The fertility, fecundity, morbidity and mortality in breeding colonies
- d. The health status, genetic constitution and physical environment of the animals

#### **Animals**

**8. Identification** (Animals must be identifiable, whether individually or in groups. Animals and their housing in approved projects should be identified using an appropriate method. The least stressful method of marking animals should be used. Housing such as pens, stalls, rooms, shed as appropriate should be marked with applicant name, project title, contact details and CHM AEC Approval number)

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9. General health and morbidity (Animals should be in good condition, in receipt of routine husbandry procedures and not suffering from any obvious ailment, injury or infestation unless approved by the AEC. Appropriate treatments must be administered as required to maintain animal wellbeing)

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**10. Behaviour** Animals should not display any deviations from normal behavioural patterns. Changes in patterns of sleeping, feeding, drinking, grooming, exploratory behaviour, performance and social and reproductive behaviour may indicate an animal is experiencing pain or distress)

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**11. Social Contact** (The number of animals in cages, pens, etc and the placement of these should enable social conditions for the species to be maintained. The impact and time of social isolation should be kept to a minimum. Animals should have appropriate opportunities to interact)
